This was one of the 'Milorg' resistance movement's many hiding places during the war and home of the 'Egret' radio station. Among other things, this radio station played an important role in coordinating air-slips from England.

The hut is well-hidden in the local terrain and usually housed 3-4 operatives.

It was nevertheless discovered in 1944, fired upon and burned by German troops. Two of the four inside the hut at the time escaped to Sweden; the remaining two were injured in the exchange of fire.

They were taken prisoner and survived.

In 1988, it was decided that 'Gjestgiveriet' – the 'Guesthouse' should be rebuilt and an exact copy of the original hut was opened in June 1990.

The simple wooden hut can be reached along a marked path as a slight detour from the Finnskogen Trail (about 1 km) or on foot from the car park at the bottom of the hill. From there, it is a 500 m easy incline to the top. The hut is open all year round and may be used by anyone wishing to do so.
