

Trip to Soli Brug

Category: Cycle trip

Length: 20 km there and back

Degree of difficulty: Easy to moderate

Region/area: Sarpsborg, Viken



Route description

From sawmill to gallery

Timber was sawn at Sanne and Soli from as early as the 17th century. Between 1860 and 1880, the sawmill was the largest in Europe, with 22 water-powered saws and around 600 employees. Operations came to an end in 1925. Soli Brug today consists of a cluster of 8 preserved buildings and the ruins of the sawmills by the River Ågård.

Important exhibitions - usually lasting a couple of weeks - are arranged two or three times a year and attract thousands of visitors from the whole of Eastern Norway. Art galleries fill four of the buildings, while visitors can wander through historic surroundings or pop in for a coffee by the pond. The buildings also feature a family house, a framing shop, a ceramic workshop and studio. Approx. 40 minutes ride from the hotel, on good roads with little traffic.
