

The Pilgrims path – St. Olav's Way

This stretch of the trail is part of the St. Olav's Way that leads north to Trondheim and the Nidaros Cathedral. In the Middle Ages the cathedral attracted more pilgrims than any other in Northern Europe, and it is still an important site of pilgrimage. We can recommend day walks and short hikes in the whole region.

Among other things, this area is known for its waving corn against a high sky. We recommend a visit to our capital city, Oslo, where one can also include visits to the Oslo Pilgrim Centre and Østre Aker Church or you can start to walk out of Oslo Airport because the trail goes close to the airport.

The Pilgrim Way passes through all three regions in Greater Oslo – you also passes the Eidsvoll Manor, one of Norway's most prestigious historical sites. It was here in the spring of 1814 that Norway's democratic Constitution was written, the foundation of the nation's independence. From Eidsvoll you can also take the Pilgrim boat – The Skibladner to Hamar and walk from there.
