

The culture destination Ramme



Experience a taste of Edvard Munch's art and life in a day.

Much of the artist's life and art can be linked to the areas surrounding the Oslo Fjord.

The culture destination Ramme in Hvitsten just south of Oslo is scheduled to open in 2020/21. Here you can experience:

- **Ramme art gallery** is a combination of a permanent and temporary exhibition based on Edvard Munch's life and work at Ramme, as well as other Norwegian artists with links to the area.
- **Munchs summer resident** (1910 until his death in 1944), restored in a 1920 style.
- **Havlystparken**, one of Norway's most spectacular gardens
- **Ramme Fjordhotell**, The hotel comprises two buildings – "Herberget" built in 1780s style and «Brenneriet» built in 1880s style. It will be a full-service hotel with 42 rooms.
- Meticulously furnished to a high standard with antiques and period furniture.

- **Ramme gård, the farm**, has been involved in organic farming since 1986. The farm focuses on traditional farming values, sustainable production and maintaining a high standard of animal welfare. Ramme gård has a visitors' area with a farm shop and restaurant/cafe serving well-balanced dishes in line with Debio's gold standard for organic foods.
