

The B21/B22 ferry from Aker Brygge offers the best value for a cruise on the Oslo Fjord at public fares. Perfect for a day trip, or weekend to Son SPA not requiring much planning. Come along for the whole journey or decend in one of the charming towns. Along the route you can explore one of the 5 beaches awarded Blue Flag. The charming towns are picture perfect sites.



Fornebu is a natural gem. A flat area accessible to everybody surronded by sea. It is the most popular new residential area

higly focused on sustainability with innovative modern architechture, has a high end shopping mall, world class art and sculptures to be admired 24/7 by the headquarters of Equinor, Telenor and Aker Solutions as well as artisan galleries and the science museum Engineerium (free of charge) where you may test your skills as an scientist.

Combine your visit with a stroll in Nansenparken, swim or play volley at Storøyodden Blue Flag beach, view birds at their local habitat and learn more about nature in Lilleøya. The historic Sjøflyhavna tavern serves delicious burgers and is certainly worth a visit. Great food and an iconic location. Fancy to live out here? Fornebu has 3 good, large hotels with all facilities, and Scandic Fornebu takes extra care of the kids during the vacations.

Vollen a real "southern pearl" with charming wooden houses where trading has flourished for 145 years and famous Arctic ships were built here. Visit the Oslofjord museum, showing the history of local coastal culture and admire the handicradt that went into making wooden boats. Activities for the children during holidays and weekends.

Fashonistas may enjoy shopping for fashion, interior design, design jewelleries and art in the charming shops and galleries. The local cafes and restaurants serves fresh bakeries and good Mediterrean food overlooking the sea, Vitos, the locals favourite is situated right on the water front.

Discover the beautiful, green and lush archipelago by renting a water jet from the Marina or just relax, take a time out or a swim off the penninsula by the museum, the Fritznersgate beach. The locals favourite place for relaxation and outdoor activities including fresbee golf. Introduce yourself to the Scandinavian sauna culture by renting the floating sauna "Varm I Vollen" at the Marina or join in on the public openings before you plonge into the sea.





Oscarsborg Fortress played a major role in protecting Oslo and the Norwegian government during the Second World War when they sank the German cruiser Blücher. Only 5 min by ferry from Drøbak, Oscarsborg is worth a visit to enjoy the beautiful location in the middle of the fjord, explore the huge canons from the war (selfie spot #1). The fortress has 5 museums, marina, hotel with meeting



rooms and several restaurants in the original fortifications. Access the digital map with QR codes and have fun exploring the life of this island in your own pace.

Drøbak is unique and the largest old town from the era of ice- and timer export by the Oslo Fjord. You'll discover many picturesque wooden houses, trendy fashion and interior shops, many galleries, cafes and restaurants. 200 years the export business florished and prosperous merchants laid the foundation for the city as we know it today.



Norwegians are fond of beautiful decorations for Christmas, and at Tregaardens Julehus, Norway's finest Christmas House and Santa's post office you find a wide selection of traditional decor. Over 20,000 wishful letters are received every year from children worldwide to Julehuset. Drøbak and Julehuset is open all year <u>and</u> on Sundays (a rarity in Norway).



Son has in recent year grown into the residens favourite spot for boating and relaxation. The Coastal Culture Centre is a

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beautifully situated right in the heart of Son. A harbor with old professional and leisure boats, exhibition, museum shop and a jeweler. Son Kro has a past as a seaside hotel in the 1800s. Today a traditional inn with beautiful view over the boat harbour and the fjord. It is a popular meeting place in Son and offers a wide choice of seasonal dishes. Son has many popular eateries and cafes.

Nesoddtangen. Have you noticed how the Oslofjord forms the shape of a Swan. At the tip of the penninsula Nessodden, Hellviktangen is what you see from Oslo looking south. A loacal gem where you find the magnificent Art Nouveau villa right by the sea, with a bautiful garden, a beach and a private pier where parties were organised for the wealthy

citizens of Oslo in the old times. They are famous for their organic, homemade quality food, served in this environment filled with soul and charm.
