

Explore the rurlar tip of the Hurum peninsula. Accessable by public transportation.

A journey of discovery in the untouched nature at Asker's southern tip, known to be one of the most beautiful stretch of coastal path along the fjord.

Tour description

The tour takes you from Filtvet lighthouse via beautiful beaches, the industrial history of Tofte, past the polar ship MS Maud which brought Roald Amundsen to the Northeast Passage and on to the art exhibitions in Holmsbu and the beautiful, colorful artists' church. Round off the hike with good food and drink at the nice restaurants overlooking the sea in the charming town of Holmsbu. There is a scheduled ferry to Filtvet brygge in the summer. Sights:

- Filtvet lighthouse stands as a landmark and is a summergallery.
- Tofte Cellulosefabrik was a wood processing factory from 1897.
 Production was discontinued in 2013.
 The workers' housing you pass is built in classic British brick style.

- At Villa Utsikten there are rooms, restaurant and a gallery.
- The polar ship Maud was built for Roald Amundsen's expedition through the Northeast Passage.
- Grave mounds from the Bronze Age
- Støa gallery & Holmsbu Art Museum
- Holmsbu Church, known as the artist's church, has a colorful and artistic interior.
- Badehotellet I Holmsbu offers rooms, sauna and a restaurant with a view of Drammensfjorden.
